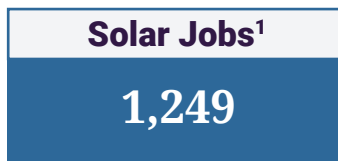

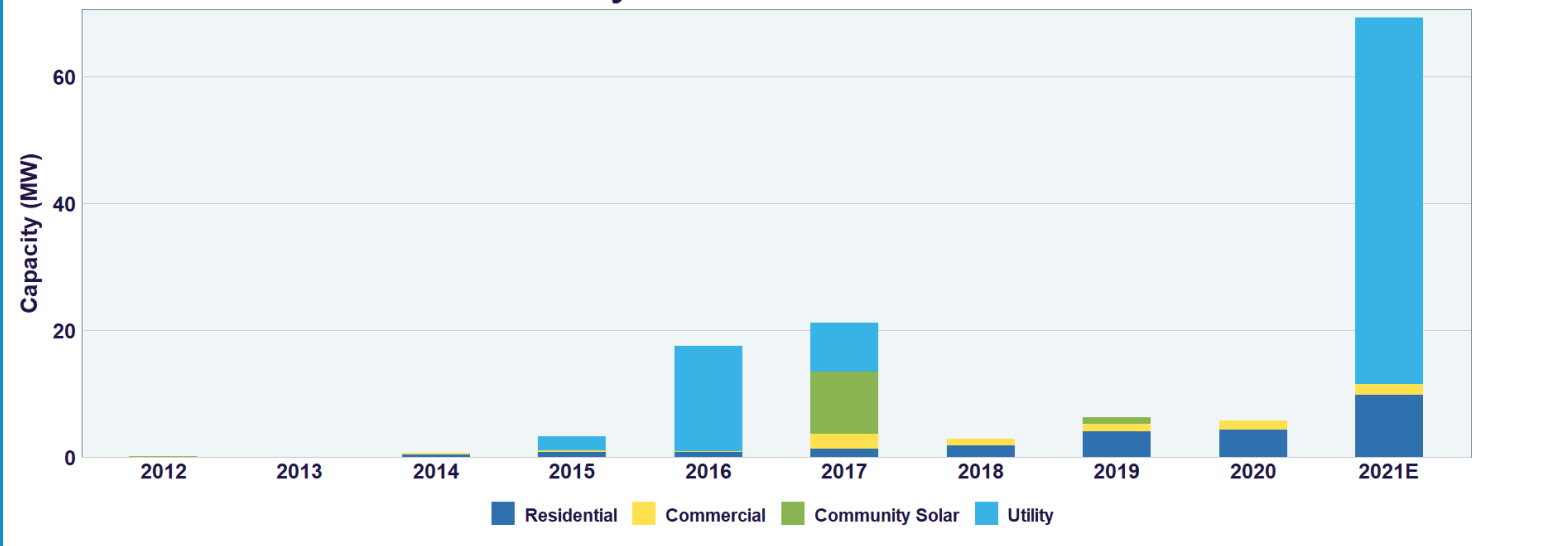

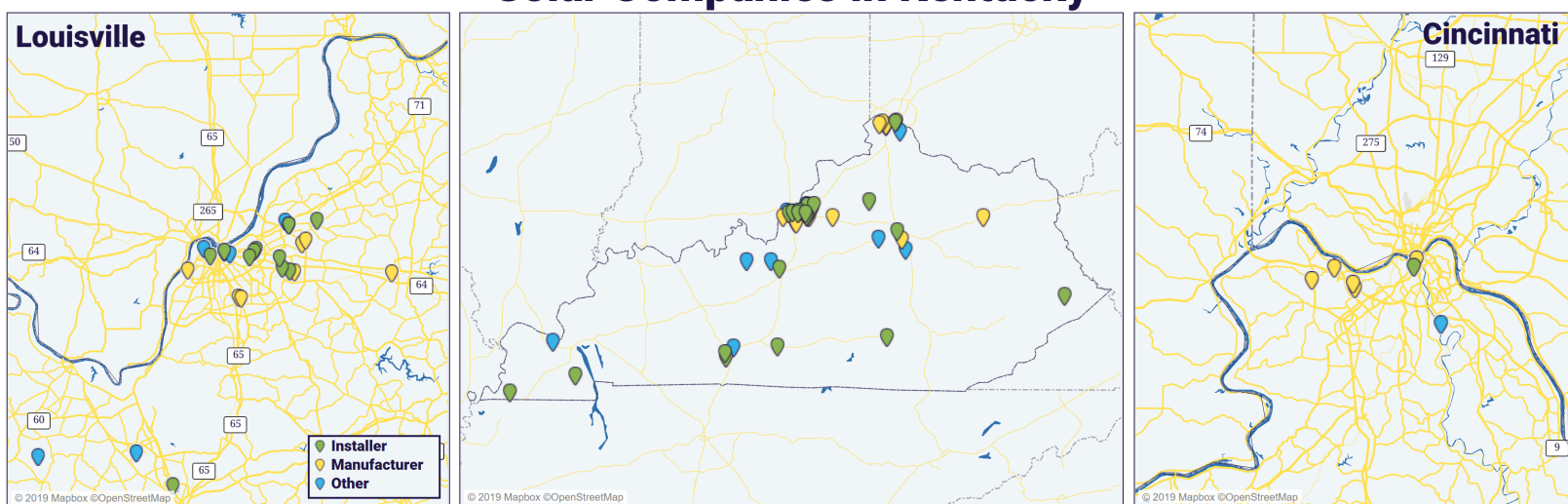
Kentucky Annual Solar Installations



More information about solar energy in Kentucky⁴

- Cooperative Solar One project has the capacity to generate 8.5 MW of electricity -- enough to power over 841 Kentucky homes.
- GGP and General Motors have both gone solar in Kentucky. General Motors has installed a 0.85 MW project at its location in Bowling Green.
- At 2 MW, Crittenden Solar Facility is among the largest solar installations in Kentucky. Completed in 2017, this photovoltaic project has enough electric capacity to power more than 267 homes.
